#### 2014 Gay Games are coming to Northeast Ohio

In addition to the \$56 million in business, the 11,000 participants and 20,000 spectators the Gay Games are expected to bring to Northeast Ohio, the events will allow the area to share a spirit that allows athletes to compete openly as gay, lesbian, bisexual or transgender people. Tom Nobbe, the Gay Games 9 executive director, went on to say "But even more important is how the games will be a catalyst for change on a personal level. And I guess this is where the Gay Games can be a little different from the Olympics and other major events."

He said Northeast Ohio competed against the Washington and Boston areas for the games and won for three reasons: this area showed enthusiasm for winning the games, the area's sporting venues were excellent and closer together than the competing cities and organizers thought it was time to expand beyond what are considered traditional "gay destinations."
