LASHRM HISTORY

Originally named the Lancaster-Fairfield County Personnel Association, the Lancaster Area Chapter Society for Human Resource Management (LASHRM) was founded in 1982. A small group of personnel managers chartered the chapter which became the 21st branch in the state and Chapter #391 of the National Society for Human Resource Management (SHRM). With more than 250,000 professional and student members, SHRM is the nation's largest professional society dedicated to the interest of human resource management.

Chapter visitors have included guests and speakers from the national, state and district organizations, as well as, experts from state government, colleges, and universities, business and industry. Each has contributed immeasurably to the exchange of ideas and information.

Past accomplishments of LASHRM include winning its first Merit Award from National SHRM for activities in 1996. The Merit Award is given to recognize excellence in chapter operations. In November 1997, LASHRM was recognized at the SHRM National Leadership Conference for its tremendous improvements in leadership, membership and participation in local and national events. LASHRM won the Merit Award again in 1998, 2006 and 2007.
